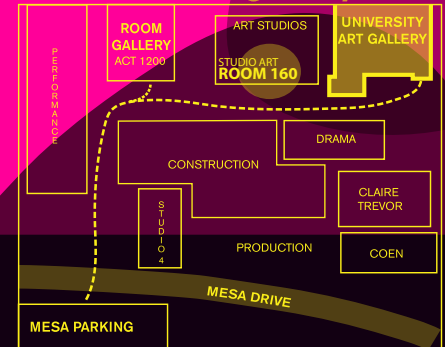

You are cordially invited to a Roundtable Panel and Curators' Walkthrough, held in conjunction with **transPOP: Korea Vietnam Remix**, a traveling contemporary art exhibition that introduces a dynamic mix of sixteen critically acclaimed artists from Korea, Vietnam, and the United States, signaling an unprecedented engagement with the rich historic and contemporary linkages between Korea and Vietnam. The featured artworks variously engage interconnections between the two countries, including the intersections of history, trauma, and contemporary popular culture.

The panel examines the past and present cultural, political, and socio-economic interactions between Vietnam, Korea, and the United States. Leading scholars and artists discuss the "Korean Wave," "V-Pop" and "Viet Wave" and the international flows of pop culture within Asia and beyond, as well as the legacies of trauma.
